Key Learning Areas – Overview of Expected Outcomes		Assessment Items (subject to change)
English	<p>Throughout the term, students will explicitly learn how to listen and speak in conversations and discussions. They will begin to examine speaking and listening in contexts that are more formal. Additionally, they will explore actions and emotions of character, examining languages and images.</p> <p>During literacy and language activities the students will be engaging in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Phonetic and spelling activities – listening to and using different spelling patterns, especially those with two letters (e.g.: ch, sh, ee, ea, th & ff) ✓ Sight word activities – repetitive exposure to the most frequently used words in our language ✓ Sentence structure – every sentence needs a capital letter, full stop and a verb ✓ Reading activities – decoding and comprehension strategies ✓ Handwriting – using the QLD cursive to practise writing and strengthening our fingers <p>Vocabulary to learn: emotion words (furious, disappointed, elated, embarrassed and envious).</p>	<p>Weeks 8 & 9: Present an oral presentation and speak about a character and the character's emotions. Can the student establish a connection between the story and their own experiences?</p>
Mathematics	<p>Through daily practise, games, investigations and explicit instruction the students will be learning how to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Compare, order and make connections between collections, initially to 20 and then to 100 ✓ Counting in 1s, 2s, 5s, and 10s from different starting points ✓ Interpret and continue patterns with objects ✓ Measure and compare lengths using informal units (can you guess how many cups it will take to fill this bucket?) ✓ Compare time duration (day, week, month and year) ✓ Tell the time using o'clock ✓ Collect data to create simple graphs 	<p>Week 6: Data handling – birthday investigation</p> <p>Week 8: Thinkboard – working with teen numbers</p>
